Fun Facts about the American Plains:

- The animals shown here include elk, American bison, deer, wild turkey, prairie dog, coyote, pronghorn antelope, black-footed ferret, greater sage grouse, and the mountain plover.
- Bison inspired the founding of the Smithsonian's National Zoo and helped spark the conservation movement. The zoo started in 1887 as an exhibit on the National Mall behind the Castle featuring American bison and a handful of species native to North America. Two years later, on March 2, 1889, Congress passed an act establishing the National Zoological Park in Washington, D.C. (Buffalo do NOT live in the U.S.)
